Position Summary

This position contributes to the success of Brookfield Zoo Chicago by generating consistent, positive exposure for the organization—extending the zoo's mission to the communities it serves.

Duties & Responsibilities

- With Government Affairs staff and members of the Education and Community Engagement team, support partnership outreach and communication through special guest visits, event planning and execution, and response to various requests from elected officials, community engagement partners, and other non-profit entities. (30%)
- With Government Affairs staff and members of the Education and Community Engagement team, researchand identify prospective partnerships that mutually highlight the assets of Brookfield Zoo Chicago and the communities served assisting in the creation of proposals to strategically engage and mobilize communities of diverse stakeholders in conservation-minded advocacy and support community relation goals. - With Government Affairs staff and members of the Education and Community Engagement team, participatein community outreach that brings awareness to the programs, events, and opportunities available through Brookfield Zoo Chicago. This is done both on-site, as well as in targeted communities within the Chicagoland area. (20%)
- Complete an independent project with objectives and details to be determined with mentor during the course of the internship, based on individual strengths, interests, and professional pursuits. (20%)

Requirements & Specifications

- High School diploma or equivalent preferred. Consideration will be extended to high schoolaged individualscurrently enrolled in, and within good standing with, the King Conservation Science Scholars program.
